Poros, Greece's well kept secret is situated in the southwest of the Saronic Gulf, opposite the Peloponnese. Poros is comprised of two islands, Sphairia and Kalavria, the former is a volcanic rock and the latter planted with pine trees. Although small, its history, sights and beaches rewards all visitors.

Welcome on board. Our Greek adventure will start in Athens. Once you are comfortable on board we will start our navigation and anchor at Love Bay, in Poros Island where you can relax and enjoy swimming. After swimming we will continue our navigation until we arrive at Poros where we will stay overnight.

DAY 1

1963

ATHENS-POROS

Monemvasia, a medieval town featuring superb architecture and cobbled streets, is an ideal getaway all year round. Monemvasia means “one entrance” and in fact the only access to this castle is via a causeway. This uniquely preserved medieval town is carved into the majestic grey rock like a sculpture. The “Gibraltar of the East” or a “stone ship” about to set sail, as the famous Greek poet Yannis Ristos described his birthplace, is a journey through time. Wander around the vaulted alleyways, churches and aristocratic mansions.

After breakfast we start our navigation to Kyparissi, a secluded paradise backed by the craggy slopes of Mount Parnon and facing the cobalt blue of the Myrtoan Sea, the ideal stopover if you like climbing, if not you can swim or enjoy water sports. Then we will continue our navigation overnight to Monemvasia and visit one of the most enchanting medieval castles in Europe.



DAY 2

1963

POROS - MONEMVASIA

The spectacular cave of Diros offers visitors the opportunity to travel back to the Neolithic era and even further. The beautiful and dramatic formations of stalactites and stalagmites formed millions of years ago, when the sea started to rise and formed the lake we see today. These spectacular caves are a wonder of nature that span over 15 kilometres with 2,800 waterways.

Another day and other spots to explore. After breakfast we will head to Diros, where you can visit the famous Diros cave complex, known as nature's underground cathedral. After swimming and visiting the cave, we will head to the mysterious region of Mani in the Peloponnese, to Gythio, a typical Greek town where you can experience real Greek life. You can enjoy freshly caught seafood served in any of the traditional taverns in the fishing port.



DAY 3

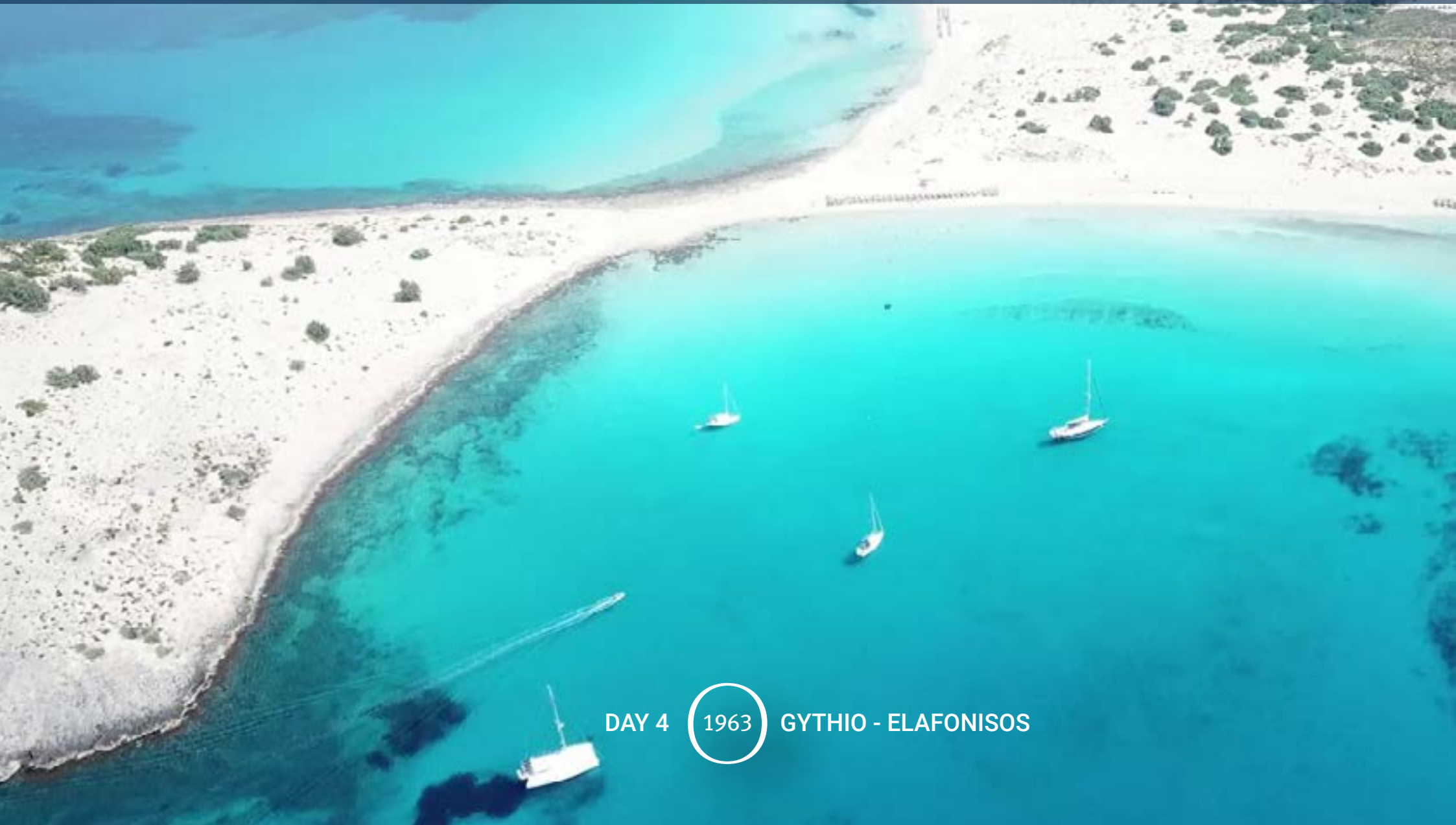
MONEMVASIA -GHYTIO

Simos beach: enormous dunes, footprints in the soft sand and sea with tropical blue color.

Simos consists of two beaches, Megalos Simos and Mikros Simos. Megalos Simos is the longest beach in Elafonisos and Mikros Simos is just a short walk from there. A narrow stretch of white sand divides these two magnificent beaches with their exotic turquoise waters.

In the morning, before we start our navigation you can visit Mistras, the 'wonder of the Morea', an archeological site, with breathtaking medieval ruins, standing in a beautiful landscape. When you return we will start our navigation to Simos, the most famous beach of Elafonisos.

Then we will continue navigating overnight to the port of Elafonisos, one of the most picturesque ports with great fish taverns and nightlife.



DAY 4

1963

GYTHIO - ELAFONISOS



Nafplion is among the most beautiful towns in mainland Greece. The town of Nafplion has an intense medieval atmosphere. A walk around the narrow paved streets of the Old Town is a trip to the past. On top of a hill above Nafplion, there is the strong fortress of Palamidi with amazing views. At the entrance of the port, there is a small islet with a fortress that once protected the town from naval attacks.

Today we will navigate to Spetses Island. Spetses Town, the picturesque capital of the island is perfect for endless strolls, while there is exotic swimming at the secluded Spetses beaches, such as the famous bay of Agia Paraskeui. After swimming, we will depart to Nafplion, a seaport town, one of the most beautiful towns in the area of Argolis as well as one of the most romantic cities in Greece.

DAY 5

1963

ELAFONISOS - NAFPLION

Spetses stands proudly just a few kilometres from mainland Peloponnese, and there is a stronger sense of carefree Greece here than in other Saronic Gulf destinations. The lively, historical old town is the only village on the island; the rest is rolling hills, pine forests and crystal clear coves. The relaxed town of Spetses has great nightlife, some of the Saronic's best restaurants and gorgeous, easily accessible swimming spots. With a rich naval history, it is still incredibly popular with yachties, and its vibrant culture attracts artists, intellectuals and lovers of a good island party.

Before our departure you can visit Mycenae to explore the remains of ancient Mycenae, a major center of Greek civilization from 1600 to 1100 B.C. Visit the small village of Epidaurus, famous for its impressive Hellenic theater. Once on board we will navigate 11 n-m and stop for swimming at Spetses Island at Zogiergia Bay. In the afternoon we will head to Spetses where we will stay overnight. Welcome to the island of the aromas!



DAY 6

NAFPILON - SPETSES

Hydra: the laid-back Greek Island with exquisitely preserved stone architecture and tiny marble cobbled lanes has always been a favourite for artists, musicians and celebrities.

Today after breakfast we will navigate to Agios Nikolaos Bay in the island of Hydra. Located on the island's southwest side, this beautiful beach features clear blue waters and is ideal for underwater fishing. We will continue our navigation to the main Port of Hydra where we will stay overnight.



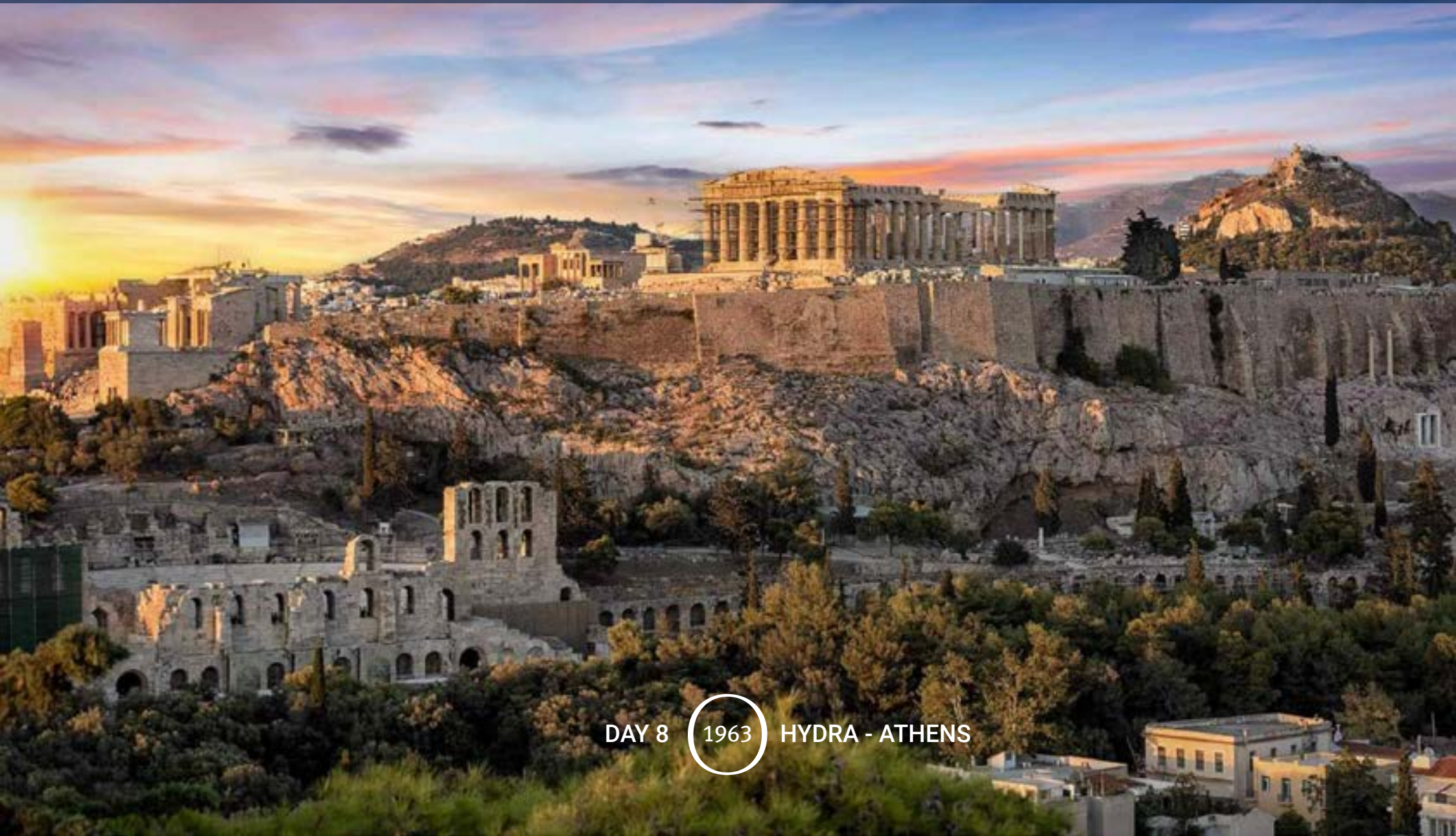
DAY 7

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SPETSES - HYDRA ISLAND

After breakfast and a morning walk we start our final trip to Athens, the historical capital of Europe and the world, where the foundations of Western Civilization was born. It is now an attractive modern metropolis with unrivalled charm while maintaining its heritage as a classical city. A large part of the town's historic center has been converted into the largest pedestrian zone in Europe, leading to the major archaeological sites.
